After completing our final preparations in Israel, we set out on a long journey of about 25 hours, with stops in Cyprus and Doha, before finally arriving in Perth (Thursday 02 October), where my dear friend Mark Smith welcomed us warmly. That very evening we went straight to Sensei Gerry Freemans' dojo in Hilton, Perth. A typical KSK basic training session was taught.

The atmosphere was wonderful, we met new friends, and for me, it marked a perfect start and smooth adjustment to Australia. During our free days, we explored Perth – visiting the aquarium, the beautiful beaches, and enjoying great restaurants. Mark took time off work and dedicated himself fully to making our stay comfortable and enjoyable.

On Friday, Sensei Shamyla (Shotokan Karate Club located in Mount Hawthron, Perth), the club owner and a wonderful friend, took us on a fun day out with her lovely children. The kids connected instantly, and we spent some truly delightful days together.

This was my second visit to Sensei Shamylas' Dojo, and I was happy to see the group's progress. I especially enjoyed training with the children, who showed remarkable focus and a true karate spirit. With the adult group, we worked on reinforcing the fundamentals of karate, achieving an impressive and satisfying level of performance. All credit goes to Sensei Shamyla, who gave her all to make our stay such a memorable experience.




From Perth, we flew to Sydney, where Sensei Kora and Ron greeted us as warmly as ever. Emma gave our meeting a special family touch, and we all enjoyed serving her with love. We visited the zoo, the aquarium, and explored the city together. In the evening, we met Sarah, a dear long-time friend, and—naturally—the conversation soon turned to karate.

After Sydney, we flew to Byron Bay – an amazing place filled with wonderful people. We stayed with Kathy and John, Mark Smith's mother and partner. Mark joined us again, taking us on trips to the Gold Coast, Movie World, and other attractions. We truly lived like top-tier tourists!

Of course, karate was always at the heart of our journey. We trained at Sensei Richard Marlins' Dojo in Lismore (Wednesday 8 October), focusing on self-defense using an ordinary T-shirt – a simple yet highly effective technique. The participants loved it, as did we.

On Saturday (11 October), Sensei Jean, the head instructor of the Byron Shire Shotokan Karate club, organized a two-hour children's class followed by an adult training session. We again concentrated on the fundamentals of karate, reaching advanced levels of performance in the spirit



We were treated to heartfelt local hospitality – Mark went above and beyond to make us comfortable, and Jean hosted us on Sunday for a day at Byron Beach, where we swam in the ocean and even enjoyed local falafel!

Next, we flew to Melbourne, where Mark handed us over to the capable hands of Starky, who took two days off work to show us Melbourne from his own personal perspective. It was a fantastic experience of fine food, beaches, and local culture.



Naturally, we didn't skip karate – on Thursday (16 October), we trained at Sensei Edji's Dojo, focusing on high-level fundamentals. The group was deeply engaged and the atmosphere was electrifying.

The next day, Sensei Nerida took charge and spent the morning with us. In the afternoon we held two quality sessions at her dojo: the children's class centered on core principles of karate, while the adult session delved deeply into the Kase-Ha philosophy, emphasizing the mental and practical aspects of karate. Everyone gave their best, and we all enjoyed outstanding, high-quality karate. Mark Sensei remarked that it was simply fantastic to train together. Special thanks to Sensei Edji and Sensei Nerida, who made these events both possible and thoroughly enjoyable.

After Melbourne, Mark drove us to Sale, where we visited Sensei Mark Johnson's Dojo. We were welcomed like family and experienced truly heartwarming hospitality. On Saturday (18 October), we held three training sessions: one for children, focusing on the basics, and two for youth and adults, emphasizing Kase-Ha karate and its self-defense applications. We concluded with Heian Nidan Oyo Bunkai – a free, practical interpretation of the kata Heian Nidan. The participants left with a sense of having learned something meaningful about themselves.

The next day, Mark Johnson took us on a tour of the Gippsland region, sharing his deep knowledge of Aboriginal history – a true privilege for us. Our sincere thanks to Mark Johnson for his hospitality, effort, and the joyful experience he created for us. And of course, over a few beers that evening, we found ourselves discussing karate in Australia and around the world – always a pleasure!

Finally, on Monday (20 October), we began our journey back home. The flights and connections were smooth, and we returned filled with unforgettable memories and a wonderful sense of joy.











In 1986, the direction of Finnish karate history changed significantly when Hans Harthoorn from the Netherlands came to Kajaani to conduct training. His visit sparked the beginning of international cooperation with the students of Sensei Taiji Kase and opened a direct connection to the Central European karate world.

Even before Sensei Taiji Kase visited Finland, few Finnish karatekas had already taken part in his seminars abroad. In the spring of 1990, Finnish karatekas participated in a seminar led by Taiji Kase and Hiroshi Shirai in Malmö, Sweden (30 March – 1 April 1990). The participants included Jarmo Laasanen and Anja Kailanko from Kajaani, Hannu Annunen from Oulu, and Raimo Lappalainen from Iisalmi. Later that year, on 7–9 September 1990, a Finnish group returned to Malmö for another Taiji Kase seminar, with Raimo Lappalainen, Harri Kähönen, and Minna Hartikainen from Iisalmi in attendance. These early contacts were crucial, as they built experience, trust and relationships that later allowed Kase Ha karate to take root in Finland.


Another important step was taken in 1989, when Jaap Smaal from the Netherlands came to Finland to conduct his first seminar on 13–15 January 1989. He continued to teach annually in Finland until 1991, further strengthening connections within the European karate network. In January 1991, Dirk Heene from Belgium visited Finland for the first time together with Jaap Smaal. This marked the beginning of a long and meaningful cooperation with Dirk Heene that continues to this day.

A Pivotal Summer at the Honbu Dojo in Hasselt, Belgium

The year 1992 became a turning point for Finnish Kase Ha karate. That summer, Finnish practitioners spent several months training at the Honbu Dojo in Hasselt, under the instruction of Dirk Heene and at seminars led by Taiji Kase. The group included Jarmo Laasanen, Hannu Annunen, later joined by Raimo Lappalainen, as well as Ilkka Piiroinen, Ari Kärki, Jari Juntunen, Niina Kauppinen, and Anja Kailanko from Kajaani. This period was one of the most significant in Finnish karate history: it laid the foundation for the establishment of the Finnish Karate Shotokan Academy and made it possible to invite Sensei Taiji Kase to Finland.

Taiji Kase in Finland

Sensei Taiji Kase visited Finland for the first time on 30 October – 1 November 1992, conducting a seminar in Kajaani. This visit was a historic and long-awaited moment for the Finnish Kase Ha community. After that, Taiji Kase visited Finland annually, teaching in Kajaani, Oulu, Iisalmi, Jyväskylä and Tampere, with his final visit taking place in 2002. His teaching and spiritual legacy have left a lasting imprint on the development of Finnish Kase Ha karate, and his influence continues to live on through the karate of his students.





Cooperation with Dirk Heene, which began in 1991, has deepened over the years. In recent times, Shihan Dirk Heene has visited Finland four times a year to conduct seminars — in February, May, July and September.

If you look closely to the picture, Maybe you might also recognise another Shihankai member, well protected against the cold (sidenote from your Secretary)

Key Seminars in 2026

6-8 February 2026 - Winter Seminar, Sonkajärvi


Sensei Dirk Heene will lead the winter seminar at Hombu Dojo (Aittokoskentie 553, Sonkajärvi). The dojo facilities include a cottage with a hot tub and a traditional Finnish sauna, as well as affordable accommodation for more than 20 participants. Transportation can be arranged from Kuopio Airport to the seminar venue and back.

24–26 July 2026 – Main Event:
Summer Seminar, Kalajoki
Kalajoki offers participants the
opportunity to experience one of the
northernmost and widest sand-beach
destinations in Europe. The extensive
beaches invite swimming, beach sports
and family-friendly activities. The
nearest airport is in Oulu. We
recommend considering a "Tour de
Finland" concept in July: arriving in
Helsinki by ferry with your own car,
then visiting Kase Ha clubs along the



route Helsinki – Jyväskylä – lisalmi – Oulu – Kalajoki. The return journey can follow the scenic western coastline through Finland's beautiful archipelago.

The Kalajoki area also includes the Rahja Archipelago and the Kallankarit islands – Maakalla and Ulkokalla, where summer boat trips are organized and visitors can explore traditional fishing culture. The Kallankarit have a centuries-old autonomous self-governance, dating back to Swedish-era regulations from 1771, and island affairs are still decided through the traditional Kari Assembly.

KSKA Aki-Gasshuku, Luxembourg, October 10th - 12th 2025 (Luxembourg)

The second weekend of October 2025 Luxembourg, the vibrant and beautiful capital of the country with the same name, Luxembourg was the place to be for many KSKA members and other karateka to attend the second Gasshuku of 2025 held from Friday October 10th till Sunday October 12th. This time of year the temperatures in Luxembourg were moderate, the sun was shining, all was good.

The training hall was located very close to the old city center. It turned out to be a modern, well maintained facility, a very good choice from the course organisation, the local club Soshin Karate EC Luxembourg, a club with a long and rich Kaseha tradition and history and untill today actively supported by Shihan Dirk Heene who travels regularly to Luxembourg to teach. Soshin also provided a bar area where sandwiches, some power food and many drinks were on offer, very nice!





The first session (open to all attending) on Friday evening was led by Sensei Nico Ibscher. Theme of this training was kata Niju Shiho. Some typical elements from the kata were taken out and studied deeply to explore the many possibilities in a typical Nico Ibscher way, always with practical applications in mind and always a challenge for the participants. As usual the buildup of the training was very good, challenging and very interesting applications were shown, explained and trained. For all details we would like to refer you to the course DVD, more info further in this newsletter.

The second session of this Gasshuku, for the KSKA members on Saturday morning was led by Sensei Jim Martin, focussing on 2 kihon and kumite combinations, starting easy but gradually building up into 2 combinations that were trained in kihon and with partner extensively. Of course there were also excellent demonstrations by Sensei Jim himself and some other senior KSKA members, that also really helped. It was a very interesting and challenging training session for most participants. It was a lot to take in for most members, but very valuable information to train on and to further develop your karate.




At the same time the non-members enjoyed a good training session with Sensei Pascal Petrella focussing on the technical basics in kihon and kumite.

After a short break, the second Saturday sessions started. The non-members enjoyed a training session with Sensei Juan Pablo Delgado, focussing on kata Bassai Dai and Kanku Dai.



The members were trained by Sensei Mike Fedyk, focussing on a combination of the 9 closed hand blocks (as part of the Shodan grading syllabus) combined with the 9 open hand blocks (as part of the Nidan grading syllabus) in both kihon and kumite. In the kumite the blocks were alternated between closed hand and open hand blockings, giving you a total of 18 combinations of attacks (tori), blocks and counter attacks (uke), counter attacks to be chosen freely or limited, for

example 1 counter attack with open hands or any other possible combination. Then repeat attacking with the ura side, gives you an exercise with 36 combinations, switch between uke and tori and you double up again to ... 72 combinations ... you get the picture? It can become a very long, challenging brain training as well, but also very physical. "Good stuff" as Sensei Michaylo would maybe say himself.



On Saturday evening, the traditional course dinner was held in a cosy restaurant called 'Elephant Rouge" (Red Elephant) offering a buffet with an interesting mix between Moroccan and Eastern food and drinks. It was a well attended course dinner as we almost exclusively filled up the entire restaurant and we enjoyed the different food styles.



The Sunday session (and last session of this Gasshuku) was a group training with everyone, led by Shihan Dirk Heene, offering a summary of the entire weekend and also (at the end of the training) going back to the form of the kata Niju Shiho. All the energy that was left in the participants bodies was used to go all out during this interesting training session. If you want more info or if you want to study all of the details, we kindly remember you that you can always order the DVD of this course to further study and train all the aspects of this training session (and the 3 other training sessions of course).


